Simon was inaugural President of The Australian Association for Professional & Applied Ethics and is a Fellow of the World Economic Forum. He is Chairman of the International Advisory Board of the Geographic Project and Deputy Chairman of the Global Reporting Initiative Board. He serves on Boards and Committees across a broad spectrum of activities in Australia.
