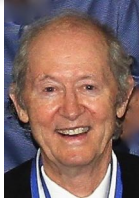

Prof. RICHARD COLLINS

"Global Warming, the Greenhouse Effect, and all that"

Prof. Collins retired in 2000 after 40 years as a scientist in industry, government and academia. The last included 20 years as Professor of Applied Physics at the University of Sydney with 4 years as Head of the School of Physics. He has chaired several Australian Government bodies, including the Australian Nuclear Science and Technology Organisation [ANSTO]

The talk will address important questions such as:

- What is the greenhouse effect and is it changing?
- Is the earth warming and sea level rising?
- Is human activity affecting these things?
- What should we do about it?
- Is all this a symptom of a larger problem?
