"Restoring Australia's Biodiversity"

"More and more species are edging closer to extinction despite Australia's capacity to prevent such a tragedy from occurring." Dr Euan Ritchie, Deakin University

Bushfires last summer saw more than 1 billion native animals wiped out across south-eastern Australia. The scale of destruction on Australia's biodiversity was unprecedented. Species which were relatively common now find themselves on the national threatened species list. Australia already has the worst rate of mammal extinctions in the world. Wildfires, predation by feral cats and foxes, feral herbivores and habitat loss are key factors driving this decline. Radical action is urgently needed if Australia is to prevent a new wave of extinctions from engulfing the continent.

About <u>Australian Wildlife Conservancy</u> (AWC) AWC is one of the largest private (nonprofit) owners and managers of land for conservation in the world, protecting endangered wildlife across more than 6.5 million hectares, in iconic places such as the Kimberley, Cape York, Lake Eyre and the Top End.
