In 2011, Gary was awarded the NSW Government Heritage Volunteer Award.

Australian Maritime Museum

Tuesday 24th October 2017 Located at Darling Harbour, the Australian Maritime Museum is Australia's national centre for maritime collections, exhibitions and research. There are basically two sections, a Permanent Gallery which, via artefacts and exhibitions, gives a chance to connect to Australia's maritime past and present in an innovative way. Secondly, one of the largest floating historical vessel collections in the world including a replica of Cook's HMB Endeavour, the destroyer HMAS *Vampire,* the submarine *HMAS Onslow* and many more. Docked at their wharves, you can climb aboard and explore. We have organised guided tours of both sites.



We meet at Reception at 10.15am, to check in, then at the onsite Yots cafe for morning tea including scones, jam and cream. The Gallery tour commences at 11.00am, followed by some of the historical vessels. The tours end about 1.00pm. Lunch at Yots Café is optional - please advise. Make your own way to the Museum for example by F4 ferry. Cost is \$25pp including morning tea and tours or \$42pp including lunch.
