# **GUEST SPEAKER**

#### Paul DELPRAT: why art is good for you Paul, renowned Mosman Artist & Prince of Wy, is the Principal of the Julian Ashton Art School. His art is held in the National Gallery of Australia and in state, municipal and university galleries as well as numerous private collections. He studied art in Paris & London and has since held exhibitions in all Australian state capitals and London. Delprat is Patron of the Mosman Art Society, Patron of Portrait Artists Australia and was Mosman Citizen of the Year 1996. In 1993, he applied to Mosman Council to build a driveway over an unmade road near Wyargine Reserve, to provide access to his property. The proposal was controversial because the road reserve had been zoned environmentally protected bushland by the Council. Delprat's plans were approved in principle, but he encountered bureaucratic errors which had to be remedied by the local council. After 11 years, Council finally rejected the application. In retaliation

council. After 11 years, Council fina rejected the application. In retaliatic at Mosman Town Hall on 15 November 2004, the Mayor had to accept Delprat's declaration for the secession from Mosman of the *Principality of Wy*, with Delprat adopting the title *Prince Paul of Wy*.


