Don Wilson: Winning the War on Waste

Waste is a recent concept. During the depression & World War II we did not waste anything but valued what little we had.

These days we are encouraged to consume. The average household wastes 30% of the food we buy. People throw out things when they have lots of wear left in them.

We have a waste crisis as our tips fill up and material ready for recycling goes into storage. Governments are not spending anywhere near enough to overcome it. Don Wilson is really concerned about this matter and has dedicated his life to promote and establish solutions to help resolve this crisis.

Don grew up in Newcastle. He was a paper boy during the war and rode the trams, prowled the pubs and stood on street corners selling papers. Following a weeding trip to Lord Howe Island Don became interested in *Bushcare* in 2000. With wife Marianne he founded Clive Park Bushcare, located on the shores of Northbridge, and later founded Bushcare's *Major Day Out*. Since watching *The War On Waste* Don studied the subject extensively and become heavily involved.

Don has received numerous community service awards including 2014 Willoughby Council's *Citizen of the Year*. He will talk on the history of plastics and the extent of the problems they are creating, then the biggest offenders.

Then, what we can all do to help **Win the War on Waste**.

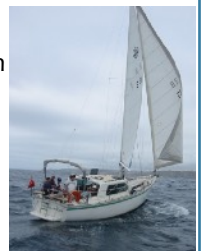

OUTINGS

Tour of VICTORIA BARRACKS Paddington Thursday 18th April

Victoria Barracks is one of the best known examples of military architecture in Australia. The Regency style barracks was designed by Lieutenant Colonel George Barney who also built Fort Denison and reconstructed Circular Quay. Most of the barracks was constructed using locally quarried sandstone between 1841 and 1849.



Our tour covers the establishment of the colony, the Army's role in its success and the Barracks' current role as Headquarters Force Command.

Our coach departs Norths at 9am and returns ~ 2pm. Morning tea or coffee and biscuits will be provided on arrival. You can make your own way to Victoria Barracks but let us know in advance; there is no parking on site.

Lunch is at Paddington RSL in Oxford Street at individual cost. Cost is \$15pp for return coach travel or \$20pp if you wish to visit the Military Museum. Photo ID will be needed.
